Experience and expertise

Ged has been a Director of PDF Management Services for over 10 years and has extensive experience in strategic planning, developing resources, delivering professional development and conducting reviews and evaluations on diverse topics.

He has expertise and experience in applying systems thinking to an array of subjects, for example, using program logic to develop new models for community based road safety programs in Victoria and applying a 'social determinants of health' model to guide improved planning for health and wellbeing in local communities. Ged has applied these concepts to develop training and resources on drug use prevention; improved food security; reduction of harm from alcohol consumption; increased physical activity participation; and promotion of health and wellbeing as a priority for local government. For example, he developed *Leading the Way*, a resource and professional development program that supports Victorian councils to create healthier communities and was commissioned to develop *Pathway to a Healthier Community*, a resource designed to support local councils in Western Australia to achieve similar ends.

Ged has led a number of strategic reviews of human services and social programs, including reviews of road safety, social housing, and community services. He has project managed other large and diverse projects. For example, he managed the development and delivery of *ShowSkills* – a program of organisational and personal change designed to make agricultural show societies more professional, viable businesses. Showskills delivered 114 two-day workshops to 354 show societies in locations across Australia.

Prior to joining PDF, Ged worked for over 15 years as a public sector manager in the Tasmanian Public Service. He held Senior Executive Service roles in disability services, social housing and child welfare, including leading Commonwealth – State negotiations. This broad array of experience in policy development at various levels of government means that he provides a strategic view balanced by practical implementation issues.

Ged maintains his interest in human services through membership of the Tasmanian Guardian and Administration Board, the Health Practitioner Tribunal and Nexus Inc – a non-profit disability accommodation service.
